This straight ahead swinger provides an abundance of teaching opportunities. To maximize those opportunities, stress the importance of good time feel. A strong time feel throughout will make much of this piece fall right in place.

All articulations are marked and should be adhered to. The opening statement of the melody at measure 9 is played in a stop time fashion, so saxophones want to make sure they are locked in with the pulse.

The solo section that begins at measure 45 may be opened up as desired. Cue backgrounds as needed. The full band returns at measure 57, with horns in unison at measure 61. A lighter approach on the unison will be beneficial. The melody returns at measure 69 to take the chart out.


