From Wayne Toews (Mentor) : The oboe part would make a good 2nd flute part if you have lots of flute players in your band.

From Jane McLauchlin (mentor) : Everyone gets a chance to be featured; an introduction to syncopation; some unison/octaves at the beginning which would require some basic tuning work for young people. Eighth notes occur on all the beats (I think?) throughout the song, so might challenge the students a bit.

## Vulcan's Forge

From Jane McLauchlin (mentor) : My students would have loved Vulcan Forge. Horn gets support from the saxes, great concepts with change of tempos, some dynamics, slurs and agogic accents - exciting for young players.

## Percussion Resources

From Jane McLauchlin (mentor) : If you have an up and coming drum set player - let them loose on this (or even just the kid who can just get by on drum set - it would be very inspiring!)

From Wayne Toews (Mentor) : Check out William Schinstine's body percussion pieces too. More advanced players will have fun with Rock Trap.

From Tom Spila (mentor) : Tom Spila, (retired from Camrose Comp. H. S.), currently directing Camrose & District Community Band

## **Slavic Festival**

From Jane McLauchlin (mentor) : Slavic festival was not in the usual Bb concert, which is nice. :-)

From Tom Spila (mentor) : Slavic Festival: Great introduction to "Slavic sounds" for young bands.

From Wayne Toews (Mentor) : Slavic Festival would be fun for your Klezmer band too! :-)

From Jane McLauchlin (mentor) : It would take some work to keep the clarinet and

alto sax moving line under the flute line in the opening. A decent lyrical piece for young band, the lines move enough to keep it interesting.

## Down by the Shalley Gardens

From Tom Spila (mentor) : Sally Garden: Like that this gives director an opportunity for some rubato work with young band.

From Jane McLauchlin (mentor) : Don - this is such a nice touch having composers intro their piece. Nicely done!

From Mireille Robinson : Agreed! Puts faces to some names I've seen on music for the last 25 years + !!

## <u>Arctic Wars</u>

From Wayne Toews (Mentor) : Arctic Wars - percussion part is more interesting than most. It's a well crafted piece.

From Tom Spila (mentor) : Arctic Wars: good dramatic piece for this level. From Jane McLauchlin (mentor) : Arctic Wars: Everyone gets a chance to shine, exciting music to play, lots going on, but not too difficult for a 1st year band, later in their year. Excellent doubling in parts between woodwinds and brass to help with some of those more difficult bits.

# The Gods of Egypt

From Wayne Toews (Mentor) : Gods of Egypt - percussion part is very challenging for this level of band.

From Kathie Van Lare (Mentor) : In picking music I always also thought about what concepts I could teach as well as the performance part. I couldn't help but think I could teach the kids about diminished chords as I was listening to the opening. From Jane McLauchlin (mentor) : The Gods of Egypt - Love how many accidentals are being used - but because the music is so interesting, students will be all over it. Challenging rhythmic ideas, but repetitive, so shouldn't be too difficult once they get the idea. I probably wouldn't do this with a first year band though - maybe to start off their 2nd year?

# In the Cool of the Evening

From Kathie Van Lare (Mentor) : Matt is a clarinet player and purposely writes clarinet parts in the lower range to prepare them for when they are working on getting over the break.

From Tom Spila (mentor) : Cool of Evening: Some nice soli moments for each section.

From Wayne Toews (Mentor) : Cool of the Evening - clarinet part stays in the chalumeau register.

# The Dragon Lord

From Jane McLauchlin (mentor) : If you don't know Darklands March, by Standridge, check it out. Gr 2.

From Wayne Toews (Mentor) : Dragon Lord - one clarinet part - chalumeau register.

## Pine Island March

From Tom Spila (mentor) : Pine Island March: clarinet part crosses break for a brief period.

# **Flowers**

From Jane McLauchlin (mentor) : Flowers: 7-8 percussion parts for a lyrical piece such a nice change for the percussionists! Kids will have to know where the melody is in that middle section or it will be lost. I generally love most things that Standridge puts out.

# **Bees**

From Tom Spila (mentor) : Bees: Fun! I can see students enjoying the novelty of this. From Jane McLauchlin (mentor) : Bees: Some great articulation challenges in here, trombones will be in heaven (or terrified), key changes, stylistic change, trills, fun effects. Great fun!

From iPhone (2)Larry : BEES-a opportunity to have a reason to teach some Chromatic scales.

# Sunset Lullaby

From Kathie Van Lare (Mentor) : Important to pick music that is not just in common time.
